

YOUTH HOCKEY

The youth hockey program consists of a combination of instructional practice sessions and games. Practices occur week nights and some weekends, while home and away games are played on weekends. Practice sessions are designed to introduce players ages 5 - 17 to the game of ice hockey by teaching the fundamentals of skating, passing, shooting and team strategy. Participants in Mite - JV levels have one practice session per week while Varsity players practice two times per week, for approximately 25 weeks. Players are placed on a team following a skill evaluation process. Players will be notified concerning the date and time of their skill evaluation sessions after registration is complete. Mite through Bantam level teams play in the St. Louis MAIHA -YD league. JV and Varsity teams belong to the Mid-American High School Hockey league in Kansas City. A game schedule will be made available to team members once arrangements are complete in late October.
